



Public Art Advisory Board Work Session Minutes

September 19, 2022 at 12 p.m.

Present

Board members present were Danny Humphress, Sara Segal, Charles Hamilton, Elizabeth Ingram, and Lisa “Tinker” Marsh. Board member absent was Michael Barimo. Staff present: Director of Communications Craig O’Neil and Recording Secretary Meghan McNeil.

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 p.m.

Discussion Item

a. Public Art Funding Discussion

The board discussed regarding their top priorities when funding is received. Danny Humphress started the discussion with talking Progress Point and partnering with Parks and Recreation board to make the park an art destination. The destination could have multiple art pieces to interact and take pictures with. It is a six-point intersection that has a lot of traffic and would get noticed by more than just Winter Park residents. Charles Hamilton mentioned installing a big art piece inspired by big cities such as Boston, Austin, NYC, etc. He mentioned trying to find an artist who would want to donate a piece to the city and the funding would be used to pay for the installation.

Elizabeth Ingram suggested adding smaller pieces of art by the lakes and near neighborhoods, adding art along city bike paths for residents to see art along the trail. Sara Segal emphasized she agreed with a previous idea discussed of installations at city entrance corridors like the recently installed Rhythmic Colors. Sara also suggested having an app or website that discusses everything the art board oversees and all the art pieces throughout the city.

All board members discussed reimplementing art exhibitions on the scale of the city’s previous *Art on the Green* initiative.

The boards five final ideas for public art funds are:

1. Progress Point - creating an art destination
2. Entrance corridors to city limits
3. Implement a robust set of curated content to promote city’s public art via an app or website.
4. New varieties of public art such as murals, video projections, painted intersections, light-based, city alley enhancement and activation, mosaics, etc.

5. Reimplement art exhibitions on the scale of the city's previous *Art on the Green* initiatives
