November 15, 2021 at 12:00 p.m.

Call to order

The meeting was called to order at 12:02 pm. A quorum was present.

Consent Agenda

a. Meeting Minutes

Motion by Jamieson Thomas, seconded by Charles Hamilton, to approve the October 18, 2021, regular meeting minutes. Minutes were approved unanimously.

Staff Updates

a. I-4 Ultimate "Rhythmic Colors"

Staff provided an update on the successful Rhythmic Colors Installation Celebration that occurred on October 29, 2021, including a summary of media coverage from that event. Board members expressed great satisfaction with the completion of the project. We would like to install three more solar lighting packages to complete the lighting elements, and that will be addressed in the new year 2022. Final paint touch ups are also still necessary as well as concrete filling in each pole.

b. Winter Park Sidewalk Art Festival "Best of Show Collection"

Staff explained that we are getting down to the wire for the Best of Show Collection installation in the new Library & Events Center.

Each piece will have a didactic with brail and is in the process of being made. All the artwork has been moved to the new location. 11 pieces at the frame shop and they will all be delivered to the site on November 29, ready to be installed. US Art will be hired for installation on December 6, 7, and 8, 2021.

Craig asked the board for their expertise on the location of each art piece since some of the pieces need to be moved due to new bookshelf height on the library first floor. Board members leaned towards deferring to Austin Reeves and two or three board members to make final placement decisions for art.

Staff also mentioned the wish to create a brochure for the entire collection similar to the Rollins Museum of Art and the brochure that RLF made for the Rhythmic Colors Installation Celebration. Board agreed this could be done in 2022.

c. Best of Show Collection remaining pieces relocation to new permanent home

The board needs to be thinking about where the remaining pieces can go. Staff mentioned the possibility of using the J.K. and Sarah Galloway Foundation Community Gallery in the Welcome Center for this purpose. Ideas from board members included the Community Center, senior centers, student areas in schools, and empty retail spaces. But this would mean the collection does not stay together which is the wish of the WPSAF Board. Perhaps a hospital or business with large wall areas might be opportunity for a partnership?

Citizen Comments

Dr. Robb Lauzon: leading a group of students doing research on citizen engagement in Winter Park. They are conducting interviews through Nov. 23 inviting all interested to participate via robb.Lauzon@ucf.edu. The interview is about behavior surrounding news gathering and engagement within winter park and local city government.

Mikayla Miller: from the Winter Park Library, observing the meeting.

Terri Bryant: thanking everyone for all the work they have been doing. This is the most uplifting project in the city for many years.

Action Items

a. Strategic Plan

Jamieson, Jeff, Danielle need feedback from the board especially in regards to funding. Craig mentioned the options. The funding goal is a high priority. Danny Humphress brought up maybe bringing this up at another meeting once we have more information regarding funding options.

b. Board Meeting on December 20, 2021.

It was decided to cancel the regularly scheduled board meeting in December due to holiday events and awaiting further strategic plan discussion based upon funding.

Board Comments

- Board members expressed an interest in participating in some way at the Winter Park Sidewalk Art Festival to let patrons know what public art is available throughout the city.

Danny Humphress made motion to adjourn and it was seconded Jeffrey Mann. With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:53 p.m.

Three additional solar light elements were added by 15 lightyears to the *Rhythmic Colors* sculpture at I-4 East onramp at West Fairbanks Avenue. Boulders will also be added to hide/protect the solar lights as we had done with the original three fixtures during the artwork installation. There are now six lighting elements and six sets of boulders in place to complete this lighting project.

The lighting elements total cost of **\$1,444** was paid for by the city's Electric Utility Department. The boulders total cost of **\$300** were paid for from the remaining funds from the I-4 Ultimate landscape allowance.
