Public Art Advisory Board Ideas for Use of Public Art Funds

REVISED AT WORK SESSION 09.19.22

1. Progress Point Park
 - Make this area a “destination” for art
 - Could it be the “Art Park” similar to Lake Nona sculpture garden?
 - Perhaps five (5) pieces for five points?
2. Entrance corridors to city limits
 - Signature art pieces such as Rhythmic Colors
3. Implement a progressive approach towards marketing with a robust set of curated content to promote all of the city’s public art pieces
 - Via an app/website/appropriate technology with artist profiles
 - Audio walking tours
4. New and current varieties of public art such as murals, video projections, painted intersections, light-based, city alley enhancement and activation, mosaics, etc.
5. Reimplement art exhibitions on the scale of city’s previous *Art on the Green* initiatives.
